## **DIRECTIONS FOR USING:**

**Cleaning for Seed**—Put in the Seed Wheat Screen; hook on the Spout to the Guide that carries the Shoe; give the Shoe the slightest shake and the Sieve the greatest pitch. Feed at the rate of 40 bushels per hour. Turn fast.

**Cleaning for Market**—Raise the sieves up an inch or more; feed at the rate of 60 to 80 bushels per hour and turn fast.

**Cleaning Coarse Grains**—Put the Oat Board under the course sieve, and give the shoe the heaviest shake.
