

Dear Sir,

Understanding that you have made a valuable invention, and recently obtained a Patent for the same, we take this opportunity of informing you that the Dominion of Canada offers a good field for its introduction.

In order to secure your interest in this country, you should at once obtain a Patent for the Invention, which will, at present, cover the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Manitoba, and British Columbia, with the Provinces of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island, when they come into the Dominion, which is expected shortly to be the case. Patents are now granted to all Foreign Inventors, irrespective of residence in Canada, or of nationality, providing application be made within one year of the date of the Patent first obtained.

The periods for which Patents are granted, are five, ten, or fifteen years, optional with the applicant, or may be extended at once from one period to another, or to the entire duration, as desired. The cost, when the case only requires the ordinary amount of drawing and specification, will be, including Government and Solicitors' fees, \$50, \$70, or \$90, on a gold basis, according to the terms sought.

We will be happy to act for you in obtaining your Patent, and, should you decide on proceeding with the application, forward us a copy of the drawings and specifications attached to your original Patent, or a full description of the invention, with a draft payable to our order for \$20: on receipt of this information the various drawings and papers will at once be prepared and sent for your examination and signature, to be afterwards returned to us for presentation at the Patent Office; a model, or samples will also be required for lodging at the Office before the Patent will issue.

It had long been our endeavor to obtain an amendment of the law, so that Foreigners might obtain Patents in Canada, and we have spent much time and money in agitating the question, not only before the Government, but also in the minds of the public, and in support of this assertion we extract the following from the "Canadian Illustrated News" of June 29th, 1872: "The public is largely indebted to Messrs. Legge & Co. for the improved Patent Bill recently introduced into Parliament, and which has now become law."
