TRANSPORTATION throughout the Sacramento River Delta is made easy by the broad reaches of the old river. On her bosom a busy fleet of both freight and passenger boats plies the year round. Barges, fast fruit launches and towering dredgers dot her surface. The charges are of course, much those collected by the railroads, the distance from river points to tidewater is such that quick transportation to the most perishable fruit products is assured. The river traffic is constantly growing, and it is only a question of a few years, we hope, when there will be a deep water highway from Sacramento to San Francisco Bay; then the products of the Delta can be loaded at any river point for direct transportation to the markets of the whole world.
